Abiding in Love

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I am honored and excited to begin my service with you as Priest in Charge on July 1, 2024. It is a privilege and joy to lead you, walk with you, and be partners in ministry as we share the Good News of God in Christ, and take part in the building of the beloved community in Foster City and beyond.

I have been part of this community at different periods in my life. I initially came here in 1992, as a young woman, and I remember being struck by the warm, welcoming environment and the deep commitment to live out the Gospel. This community helped me discern the call to the priesthood, and lovingly shepherded me, asked hard questions with me, challenged me, and invited me to grow as a leader and a person of faith. In 2014, members of St. Ambrose were there at Grace Cathedral when I was ordained a priest. I left to do some challenging and fulfilling work in another wonderful community, Holy Child and St. Martin Episcopal Church in Daly City. After 8 rich and fruitful years there, I returned to St. Ambrose to do long term supply work. Again, I was deeply moved by the love, the sense of community and the great resilience I saw, even after going through the retirement of a long-time, much-loved Rector, a search that was done in the midst of a pandemic under Father Shane, and then the departure of Father Jason. A lot happened in a short period of time, and you kept the faith

I want to commend the strong pastoral and administrative leadership of the Vestry during this time, especially that of Hamilton Wong, Senior Warden, April Cherrington, Junior Warden, and Treasurer and Livestream Coordinator, Alison LeBlanc. Your faith, your prayers, and your love and hope have inspired us all.

Most of all, I'm grateful for the wonderful servant ministry that I see in every one of you. You are the heart of Christ's church, and your prayers, your presence, your acts of love, of time given for the community, are such a blessing. And I see how you care for one another, day by day. More than anything else, more than programs or events or beautiful liturgies, it's that day by day bearing of one another's burdens that proclaims the love of Jesus, and brings light and hope to the world.

I'm looking forward to serving with you in this community. As your priest, I want to minister with you and alongside you. I believe I am called to encourage, to help equip you for your ministry, both here and in the world. I will seek to provide spiritual nourishment from the riches of the Scripture and our tradition, and to hold before our eyes week after week, the Great Story, the vision of the Kingdom of God, that is at the heart of Jesus' message. I will work among you as pastor, teacher, shepherd, companion and friend, and together we will walk on the journey of growing in grace and into the stature of Christ.

I also know that I have much to learn from all of you. And I know that this has been a difficult time, a time of change, of loss, and perhaps hurt and disappointment. We can be present to that, and it is right and good to lament and mourn.

I believe that on this pilgrim journey we go through some rough and rocky country, and yet even there, God's love will bloom gloriously! May God bless us all as we walk together in faith, sure of the love of Jesus that lives in our hearts.

Public Service Announcement: Watch out for e-mail scams St Ambrose

Over the past 3 years, my husband and I have been receiving scam emails. It started with Fr. Shane and continued with Fr. Jason. I first received an email that appeared to come from Fr. Shane at the very beginning of his ministry at St Ambrose, right after Fr. David retired. It appeared Fr. Shane was contacting me and asking me for a favor. The favor was to purchase gift cards to help support a friend who had cancer, the emails stated it was urgent and needed to be done that day, and he was happy to reimburse me in the following days. I thought it was rather odd. At that time, I had only met Fr. Shane a couple times and honestly was unsure if this was something a priest might do. I contacted Fr. Shane, who assured me he would never ask for a gift card or money. I took it upon myself to contact Foster City Police department and forwarded the email to them. An officer spoke to me saying scams like this are very common and almost impossible to catch the responsible parties.

Since then, Jon and I continue to receive requests every few months.

Recently I received a message supposedly from our choir director asking for the password to our church directory. I was puzzled as to why she would ask me instead of someone in the choir? I replied saying I didn't have the password, then 3 weeks later I received a second request. I reported this one to Hamilton and Valerie and deleted the email.

Last weekend I spoke to Nilda and others, and learned that they too have received similar emails and requests.

Sadly, we all have to have our guard up with regard to the internet.
